

This incredible piece of legislation will invest \$370 billion in climate action: far and away the greatest investment this country has ever made in climate action. The IRA took more than a year to pass through Congress before President Biden signed it into law a couple of weeks ago. It went through many changes, but ultimately it's a win for our planet and for the green economy in the US. The bill will set us on track to reduce our GHG emissions by 40% by 2030.

The Senate Democrats have the best plain-language breakdown of the IRA we can find. But here's the TL;DR of what the bill aims to do:

Decrease consumer energy costs: \$9 billion in home energy rebate programs, 10 years of tax credits for clean home energy and efficiency, tax credits on used and new "clean" vehicles, and \$1 billion to make affordable housing more energy efficient. Good stuff, right?

Increase domestic energy security: More than \$60 billion for clean energy manufacturing will add an estimated 1 million jobs to the economy and relieve supply chain pressure on things like solar panels and EVs.


Reduce emissions across all sectors: More than \$75 billion in tax credits, grants, and R&D investments will decarbonize electricity production, agriculture, transportation, manufacturing, and buildings.

Support environmental justice: With over \$60 billion earmarked for investment in the communities most vulnerable to the effects of climate change, the IRA seeks to increase equity and access to the clean economy.

Strengthen rural, agricultural, and forest climate resilience: Over \$27 billion will go to clean energy, conservation, and infrastructure to give rural and farm communities the resources they need to take leadership on climate solutions.
